**Frappante has its roots from the German type foundry
Genzsch & Heyse, based in Hamburg and founded by
Emil Julius Genzsch (1856-1906). Many type foundries
ceased to exist in the 70's and 80's or was bought up
by bigger foundries. The later was the case for G&H
as it was taken over by Linotype in 1963.**

**The original typeface which Frappante is based on was
named Frappant and designed in 1913 by the German
designer Heinz König (1856-1937). After it was found
in an ad in a Swedish book printer magazine from
the early 20th Century It was undoubtably
too good to be forgotten.**

The original for Ganghofer was first found in a schriftpoben (type specimen) from the book printer G. Kreysing in Leipzig dated from 1911. After some research it turned out to be Fette Teutonia originally issued by the H. Hoffmeister foundry in two weights in 1903.

Adopted by D. Stempel AG. after the acquisition in 1904 and still carried in the 1920s. The type designer for Teutonia remain unknown.

The Frankfurt-based type foundry Stempel started in 1895 by David Stempel. Took over Roos & Jüne in 1915. Gained a majority share in Klingspor Bros in 1917. Takes over Leipzig's Heinrich Hoffmeister foundry in 1918 and Leipzig's W. Drugulin foundry in 1919. Gains shareholding in the Haas'sche type foundry in 1927, and Benjamin Krebs in 1933. It becomes owner of Klingspor in 1956. In 1980. Stempel's type division was taken over by Linotype, and became Linotype's type department.

HEROLDINA



Heroldina is inspired by the German type tradition from the beginning of the 20th Century. It recalls in small parts of the typeface Reklameschrift Herold from H. Berthold AG from 1901 (type designer was Herman Hoffman. In Heroldina the proportions and blackness have changed. The Jugendt characher is mostly taken away but kept a bit in the numbers.

H. Berthold AG was founded in 1858 in Berlin by Hermann Berthold. Also known as H. Berthold Messinglinienfabrik und Schriftgiesserei, the type foundry was the largest in the world by 1918, with offices in Stuttgart, St. Petersburg, Leipzig, Riga, Budapest and Vienna. it was finally dissolved in 1995.

SINKWITZ-VERSALIEN

Pinkwizen has its origin in Sinkwitz versalen. As the name suggest, Sinkwitz missed out lower cases. Still it deserved to be brought into the digital era. The MRF-version is developed into a playful Unical script. Despite its historical mark, a full Latin Extended set makes it ready for modern design.

Paul Sinkwitz (1899-1981) was a designer and painter.

Sinkwitz studied at Kunst- gewerbeakademie Dresden in former East Germany. He settled in 1922 in Hellerau and moved to Stuttgart in 1955 where he was an art professor. His typefaces include the semi-calligraphic semi-Blackletter typefaces Sinkwitz Gotisch and Versalien in 1942 at Schelter & Giesecke. These became part of the Typoart collection in 1950.

and fall into the tradition of making heavy
weight typefaces, popular in German design
in the beginning of the 20th Century.
The design is not unique and there are
similar type designs to be found among
many of the German foundries.**

**Even if the design have strong historical
roots, it can successfully be used in modern
applications such as posters, book covers,
packages etc. It is up to brave graphic
designers of today to find its
perfect purpose.**

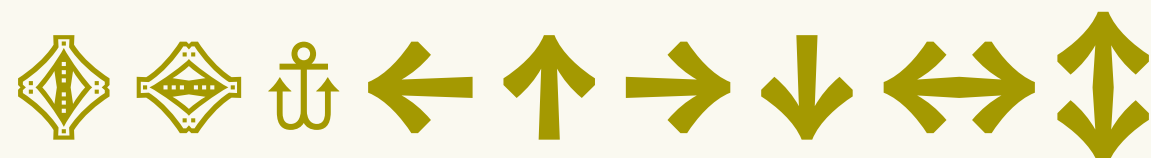
